

## Summer Reading Requirements

**6th grade** students may read from either the Children's or Junior Book Award lists (including Island Favorites). Students must pass an AR quiz (60 or better) for each book in order to count it as Summer Reading.

**7th graders** will read from the Junior Award lists (including Island Favorites). Students must pass an AR quiz (60 or better) for each book in order to count it as Summer Reading.

**8th grade students** may read from either the Junior (including Island Favorites) or Young Adult\* Award lists. Students must pass an AR quiz (60 or better) for each book in order to count it as Summer Reading. \*YA titles may cover mature subjects.

### Summer reading can help with QI reading requirements!

**CP students will be required to read a total of three books during the first quarter of the 2017-18 year. They may use one of the books they read as summer reading toward the QI total of three. The other summer reading books will count as extra credit.**

**Honors students will be required to read a total of four books during the first quarter of the 2017-18 year. They may use two of the books they read as summer reading toward the QI total of four. The other summer reading books will count as extra credit.**

## Back This Year!

**Students who read three titles from the summer list and pass the AR quiz (60 or higher) by July 26 qualify for the incentive party at JICP. Read two books to earn a cookout at school.**

**ALL AR QUIZZES MUST BE TAKEN BY NOON, July 26, 2017, TO QUALIFY FOR THE SUMMER READING INCENTIVES.**

# Summer Reading 2017

CRMS provides the Summer Reading Program as a way for students to continue with their reading progress throughout the summer vacation. Students' reading requirements are based on the grade they will enter in the fall. **SUMMER READING WILL HELP STUDENTS FULFILL QUARTER ONE READING REQUIREMENTS.**

Students who complete two books (and pass the AR quiz) will be treated to a cookout on campus during lunch. Students who read three or more of the summer reading requirements by July 26 will be eligible for a field trip to JI County Park.

Copies of the summer reading titles are available for checkout at the CRMS media center during the summer reading hours and at branches of the Charleston County Public Library.

All summer reading AR quizzes must be taken and passed with a grade of 60 or better by noon, July 26, 2017, to qualify for the party.

One summer reading book will count toward QI reading requirements.
